



## Murrayshall Wine List 2019

We have revised our wine list for the 2019 season. In keeping with the rise in popularity of wine and it's selection by grape variety we have laid out the list accordingly. In here you will find old favourites that are complimented by some less well known wines. To enhance your choice we are able to serve more wines by the glass through our recently installed Verre de Vin wine preservation system.

### Murrayshall and the Barossa Valley

General Thomas Graham, 1st Baron Lynedoch, GCB, GCMG, GCTE (1748 – 1843) was a Scottish aristocrat, politician and British Army officer who inherited the Murrayshall Estate. His great friend Colonel William Light, in December 1837, named a town in the Barossa Valley, Lyndoch (mis-spelt by Light) after his esteemed friend Lord Lynedoch who was his Captain in the Battle of Barrosa, Spain, in 1811. Not far away from Lyndoch is the Yalumba Winery founded in 1849 by Samuel Smith, a British migrant and English brewer, who had brought his family to Angaston in the Barossa Valley seeking a new life. Smith and his son began planting the first vines by moonlight. Samuel named his patch "Yalumba" – aboriginal for "all the land around". Five generations and 170 years later, Yalumba is Australia's oldest family owned winery. We showcase 2 varietals, Viognier and Shiraz.

## Champagnes and Sparkling Wine

A family owned champagne house ran by three sisters who each run a separate strand of the business. This cuvee contains a large percentage of Pinot Meunier giving an approachable wine with strawberry leaf and citrus aromas.
- 2 Baron Albert Rosé Champagne, NV** £56.00

A soft and subtle rosé wine with attractive pink colour. Red fruit and brioche notes with a backbone of fine bubbles.
- 3 Joseph Perrier 'Cuvée Royale' Brut, NV** £65.00 £11.50

A remarkable and noble Champagne house still under family ownership. Fresh fruity aromas such as pear and red apple lead to richer fresh bread notes and a touch of biscuit. The wine is aged for a minimum of 3 years in their cellars giving complexity and sophistication.

- 4 Joseph Perrier Blanc de Blancs NV** £70.00

The nose is elegant and complex. Aromas of white flowers, apricot and Mirabelle plums. The palate has plenty of fresh citrus notes and lively acidity, some touches of spice and vanilla, rich brioche elements and a long lemony finish.
- 5 Joseph Perrier Brut Rosé NV** £72.00

Predominantly made from Pinot Noir with a touch of Cumières Rouge, a still wine made from Pinot Noir, this has delicate aromas of raspberries and blackcurrant alongside sensuous flavours of jam and marmalade.
- 6 Bollinger Special Cuvée, NV** £85.00

The purest expression of Bollinger's house style, this has a biscuity nose and a rich yet balanced palate.
- 7 Prosecco Spumante, La Delfina, Veneto, Italy** £31.00 £7.00

Gentle playful bubbles and lemon and pear fruit. Delicious anytime!

## White Wines

- 8 **Chardonnay, Victoria Park, South Australia, 2017/18** £27.00 £6.50 £9.50  
An unoaked wine with ripe melon and papaya fruit, a rounded texture and juicy finish.
- 9 **Chablis, William Fèvre, Burgundy, France, 2016/17** £49.00  
A typical pale hue with a glint of green. An attractive minerality, steely but with a presence of ripe white fruits. A fine structure with refreshing acidity.
- 10 **Pouilly-Fuissé, Bouchard, Burgundy, France, 2017/18** £55.00  
Aromas of fruit and floral notes. A very perfumed, silky and elegant wine.
- 11 **Chenin Blanc 'The Den', Painted Wolf, Coastal, Region, South Africa, 2017** £27.00  
A lively medium bodied wine, with flavours of creamy pineapple, pink lady apples and melon. Subtle use of oak adds richness and body yet the refreshing acidity maintains a clean finish.
- 12 **Pinot Grigio, La Delfina, Veneto, Italy, 2017/18** £23.00 £6.00 £7.50  
Everybody loves Pinot Grigio with its soft texture and pear and nutty aromas.
- 13 **Pinot Grigio, Villa Sandi, Veneto, Italy, 2017/18** £27.00 £6.50 £9.50  
Pale straw yellow colour; light stone fruit, mildly mineral nose with some floral and lemon drop notes; dry, fresh lemon and mineral flavours with crisp finish.
- 14 **Riesling Trocken 'Solitär' SA Prum, Mosel, Germany, 2017/18** £29.00  
The modern face of German wine. A dry expression the amazing Riesling grape with aromas of apricot and peach, and fresh fruit flavours and a mineral character on the finish.

- 33 Pinotage 'The Den', Painted Wolf, Coastal Region, South Africa, 2017** £29.00  
 An intense fruit packed wine with a smorgasbord of red and black summer berries, savoury spice and toasty wood flavours. The wine has fine bright tannins and a long fresh finish.
- 34 Pinot Noir, Giesen Estate, Marlborough, New Zealand, 2014/16** £27.00  
 A Pinot Noir with vibrant red cherry, bramble, earthy nuances and warm spice. Silky, smooth, supple and well-structured. Fruit from vineyards throughout the Wairau Valley in the Marlborough wine region. A bright, aromatic and elegant style of Pinot Noir.
- 35 Chianti, Villa Cardini, Tuscany, Italy, 2016/17** £28.00  
 With subtle aromas of violets and a fresh, fruity tang in the mouth, this lighter style of Chianti is superb with or without food.

- 41 Botrytis Sémillon Deen Vat 5, De Bortoli Riverina, Australia, 2015, 37.5cl**      £26.00      £9.50  
Classic botrytis characters of dried apricots and marmalade are supported by a touch of vanillin oak in this excellent dessert wine from the Riverina. The little brother of the world famous Noble One.
- 42 Late Harvest Viognier Sauvignon Blanc, Colchagua Valley, Chile 2015 37.5cl**      £21.00      £6.50  
A very pleasing dessert wine, the white peachy flavours of the Viognier are kept in track by a balanced acidity offered by the Sauvignon.
- 43 Torres Floralis Moscatel De Oro IGP, Penedès, Spain 37.5cl**      £27.00      £10.50  
Since 1946, the Torres family has been making Floralis-Moscatel Oro, once of the most characteristic dessert wines of the Mediterranean, a nectar of unmistakable floral aromas with a voluptuous and sensual palate.
- 44 Château Petit Guiraud, Sauternes, Bordeaux, France, 2013, 37.5cl**      £31.00      £11.50  
The greatest sweet wine producing area in the world. The autumnal mist that oozes from the River Garonne allows the rot that invades the grapes that concentrates the sugars that give an amazing honeyed richness to this nectar.

## After Dinner Sherry

**45 Oloroso 15 y.o. 'Dry Sack' Williams and Humbert 50cl** £50.00 £10.00

The nose shows lots of caramel and Seville orange, and a warming character. The palate has very nice fruit, with a bready flavour and more raisin and plump sultana, though refreshingly dry with a pithy core of acidity.

**46 Pedro Ximenez 12 y.o. Collection, Williams and Humbert 37.5cl** £20.00 £6.50

Once harvested the Pedro Ximenez grapes are left out in the Andalusian sunshine for about 10 days until they become almost raisin. Ageing is by oxidation process in soleras for a minimum of 12 years. Deep aromas of raisins and figs. Mouth-wateringly luscious, smooth and velvety, very rich and sweet with a delightfully long aftertaste.
